

Children and youth are connected to positive adults, peers and activities that help them be engaged and involved in their community, be healthy, make good choices and adapt to change.

- Supports to address family violence, addictions and/or mental health challenges
- Children and family counselling programs focused on healthy decision making, coping skills, building self-esteem and resiliency
- Programs that strengthen positive parenting skills and a supportive family environment

- Recreation programs that provide a safe and supportive environment where youth can build strong positive peer relationships and develop a sense of belonging

Community Partner Clothing Referral Program

The Community Partner Clothing Referral Program offers free, high-quality clothing to low-income community members. The program allows individuals to divert financial resources to other basic needs, reduces stigma, and provides individuals the tools that they need to improve their well-being.

1 Thunder Bay Counselling Psychosocial Counselling



The Psychosocial Counselling Program is a core service offered by Thunder Bay Counselling which provides counselling, psychotherapy and support services for issues such as mental health, depression, anxiety, addiction, grief, and relationships, for individuals and families, across the lifespan, of whom a majority are low income and have limited or no access to primary care.

Show Your Local Love Day




